Prevent Duty Statement

In order for school to fulfil the statutory Prevent Duty by ensuring that staff are able to identify children who may be vulnerable to radicalisation, and know what to do when they are identified:

1. We have adopted the model LA Safeguarding Policy which incorporates a paragraph in regards to Preventing Radicalisation. This policy is available to all staff and parents on the school website and within school. Staff have signed to acknowledge that they have seen the policy. Governors review the policy on an annual basis.
2. Mr Birdsall as Designated Safeguarding Lead has completed the Level 3 WRAP Training provided by West Yorkshire Police and the Safeguarding Children Board.
3. Staff have completed basic awareness safeguarding training which incorporated radicalisation.
4. Mr Birdsall has led a staff briefing to ensure that all staff are aware:
 - a. That he is the Designated Safeguarding Lead and has received the appropriate Prevent training.
 - b. That any concerns in terms of the prevent agenda should be dealt with in exactly the same manner as all safeguarding concerns and that he should be informed immediately. Mr Birdsall will then follow the correct procedure. In the event of Mr Birdsall's absence then the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads, Mrs Chinn and Mrs Charles, would follow the correct procedure.
 - c. Of the current local position.
5. Staff risk assess vulnerable pupils and work in partnership with appropriate outside agencies.
6. Mr Birdsall has led a whole school assembly in terms of the prevent agenda.
7. We promote British Values, and therefore developed pupils' resilience to radicalisation, within school assemblies and through display.
8. We integrate internet safety within each unit of the IT curriculum.
9. We promote internet safety through activities throughout school during Internet Safety Week.
10. We teach pupils about the need for mutual respect and understanding and the diverse national, regional, religious and ethnic identities within the UK through Religious Education and PSHCE sessions.
11. We ensure that IT filters block inappropriate sites including radicalisation and extremism.
