<b>Unit of Work</b>	RE – Why is Jesus inspiring to some people? (L2.3)
<b>Text Driver the Unit of Work Links to</b>	N/a
<b>Key Strand</b>	Believing: Religious beliefs, teachings, sources; questions about meaning, purpose and truth
<b>Overview of the Unit of Work</b>	Pupils will learn about Christianity in depth, exploring different reasons why Jesus is considered an inspiring figure by Christians – and by many other people too. They will explore what makes a person inspirational to others, identifying the characteristics of a good role model, including the words and actions of Jesus, which continue to inspire Christians today. Additionally, pupils will develop the understanding and skills needed to appreciate and respond thoughtfully to a range of key questions to develop their own responses.
<b>Prior Learning &amp; Vocabulary</b>	Throughout Year 3, pupils have been building their understanding of Christianity, God and the way Christians choose to live their lives in accordance with the teachings of their religion. Pupils will be familiar with Christian artefacts, rituals and beliefs. In Year 4 Autumn term, pupils considered how religious teachings affect the actions of believers in terms of how they choose to live their lives.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> Christian, Christianity, God, Jesus, Bible, faith, religion, worship, prayer, festival, forgiveness, honesty, generosity
<b>Sticky Knowledge</b>	Pupils will learn: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The events of Holy Week and Easter to find out why Jesus is important to Christians today</li> <li>• How the events of Holy Week are celebrated by Christians</li> <li>• Why Christians call Good Friday ‘good’, linking to incarnation and salvation</li> <li>• The impact that believing in Jesus can have on a Christian’s life</li> <li>• The importance of the Holy Spirit to help Christians follow Jesus and be more like him due to the belief that people cannot be completely bad or good</li> <li>• The most important attitudes and values to have, as inspired by Jesus (e.g. love, fairness, service, sacrifice, joy)</li> </ul>
<b>New Vocabulary</b>	salvation: deliverance from sin and its consequences, believed by Christians to be brought about by faith in Christ incarnation: a person who embodies in the flesh a deity, spirit or quality Holy Week: the week before Easter, starting on Palm Sunday

	<p>Easter: Christian festival celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ</p> <p>Holy Spirit: the third person in the Trinity. God's presence on Earth</p> <p>sacrifice: give up (something valued) for the sake of other considerations</p> <p>values: the importance, worth, or usefulness of something. Standards of behaviour.</p>
<b>Post Learning</b>	<p>Y5 Autumn term: pupils will explore in more depth the impact that believing in Jesus has on a Christian's life and why people choose to believe or not to believe.</p>
